#### Selection criteria:

The following criteria are designed to help to assess the applicants' potential. These criteria should not be evaluated individually, but rather should be included in the overall assessment of the applicant.

#### 1. The applicant's academic career and scientific achievements to date

(Weighted at a maximum of 3.5 points)

- a. Level of commitment and consistency shown in the applicant's various career stages
- b. National and international mobility
- c. Breadth of specialist knowledge
- d. Examination results
- e. Academic productivity (publications, teaching)
- f. Experience of acquiring third-party funding

#### 2. The applicant's international experience and contacts

(Weighted at a maximum of 1.5 points)

- a. Quantity, intensity and quality of the applicant's international experience
- b. Sufficient breadth of the applicant's international contacts

#### 3. Quality of the key publications submitted by the applicant

(Weighted at a maximum of 0.5 points)

- a. Originality and degree of innovation
- b. Significance for the further development of the topic area

#### 4. Originality and quality of the applicant's planned research project

(Weighted at a maximum of 3.5 points)

- a. Originality, innovative scientific methods, focus
- b. Contribution to the applicant's further academic development
- c. Feasibility of conducting the research at the host institute
- d. The project's chances of success during the proposed funding period

(Weighted at a maximum of 1.0 point)

- a. Potential to enhance or add to the institution's academic profile
- b. Potential to improve international and national links
- c. Potential to acquire more third-party funding for the institution
