## Enclosure to the application for participation in the *SI Summer Academy for Young Professionals 2014*

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### **CASE/PROJECT (Instructions)**

As an applicant to the SI Summer Academy for Young Professionals 2014 you must write a short case/project outline concerning an actual task, challenge or possibility that you have encountered in your current capacity either as a Master's level student or as a young professional employed in the public administration in Belarus, Georgia, Moldova or Ukraine. It is important that your case is related both to the thematic area of the programme, and to your current work (or studies). The case should highlight an issue that you find important and would like to address in your work.

The case must not exceed 2 pages in total, and it is recommended to include the below-mentioned headlines. It is also strongly recommended that the case is developed in close collaboration between you and your closest head/director (if you are a professional) or academic supervisor (if you are a student).

- Case/project background and description  
*(The project should be based on a relevant problem/challenge (or possibility for improvement) that you, together with your organization have identified as important to address)*
- Purpose/Aim  
*(How will your project contribute to development of public administration within your home environment?)*
- Potential partners/Stake holder involvement  
*(Describe which other partners/stake holders that might be needed to involve, and in which capacities/roles)*

Remember that the case will form an integral part of your application, thus evaluated for quality and relevance. But the case may also be part of your training in Sweden. Together with the other participants in the programme you will discuss how to develop a case further and how to put it into action.
