7. Funding for Camp Participation

The fee for participation in the Camps is 800 euros. This fee will cover tuition, on-site accommodation with breakfast, camp materials and planned excursions. *Participants will be responsible for paying for their own meals,* as well as travel to the location of the Camp. Those costs are not included in the participation fee.*

For participants from Albania, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Bulgaria, Croatia, Greece, Kosovo, Macedonia, Montenegro, Romania and Serbia, there will be a scholarship to cover the costs of the Camp. The scholarship will pay the full 800 euro fee, including: tuition, on-site accommodation with breakfast, Camp excursions and materials for camp participation, including tools, papers, etc. *Participants will still be responsible for covering their own meal costs,* as well as travel to the location of the Camp.*

*Note: CHWB will cover meal costs only for participants of the Camp in Rogljevo, Serbia, due to the lack of dining options in the village where the Camp is located.

ROGLJEVO

What's so special about Rogljevo?

Located in the beautiful, rolling countryside of eastern Serbia, the small village of Rogljevo has around 120 *pivnice*, or wine cellars. Originally built between the 18th and 20th centuries, a few are active even today, producing a delicious array of wine and *rakija*. Rogljevo is an intimate space, where Camp participants can experience the gentle pace of village life, sleep and eat traditional Serbian dishes in a local house and taste the produce of the surrounding vineyards.



What happens during the Camp?

During the Camp, participants in Rogljevo work with wood or stone to restore some of the historic *pivnice*. In the end, this work will go toward supporting Rogljevo's bid to be listed along with nearby Rajac and Štubik on the UNESCO World Heritage List. Lectures in Rogljevo cover such topics as cultural heritage management, conservation materials and methods, site documentation, and heritage interpretation.

MITROVICA

What's so special about Mitrovica?

Mitrovica is a hidden jewel of Kosovo; despite its portrayal in the media, the city is safe and welcoming. Once an important industrial city, focused on the Trepča mine, and the rock-n-roll capital of ex-Yugoslavia, Mitrovica also offers a mix of Albanian, Serbian, Turkish and Roma cultural and religious influences. Camp participants can look forward to great food and the world's best macchiato.



What happens during the Camp?

Participants in Mitrovica will focus on object conservation and interpretation at the Museum of Mitrovica, which holds one of the most important collections in Kosovo. Lectures and exercises held during the Camp will cover such topics as the conservation of museum artifacts, principles and methods of documentation, bringing museum objects to life through interpretation, and more.

GJIROKASTRA

What's so special about Gjirokastra?

From the powerful castle to the tall stone houses to the twisting bazaar, Gjirokastra is just magical. 'The City of Stone' has hosted the Camps since 2007, inspiring hundreds of participants with its towering monuments, high mountains and broad valley. Listed as a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 2003, Gjirokastra has only recently begun to halt its slow decay, and the Camps are a big part of that effort. As a participant in Gjirokastra, the city becomes a part of you in a unique way.



What happens during the Camp?

In Gjirokastra, participants perform small repairs to the monumental houses, working with wood (entrance gates, windows), stone (surrounding walls, gate roofs) or plaster (interior and exterior facades). Similar to the Camp in Rogljevo, the lectures in Gjirokastra will focus on the materials and techniques used in conservation, documentation and value analyses, heritage management and interpretation.
