We invite scholars from economics and cognate disciplines to submit extended abstracts or full papers. Topics include, but are not limited to:

- Cultural, economic, and institutional legacies of empires, socialist regimes, and wars
- Long-run persistence of values and attitudes
- Determinants of individual socioeconomic outcomes and behavior
- Spatial and historical determinants of economic policies and development
- Economic reforms in (post-)transition countries

Preference will be given to papers focusing on Central and Eastern Europe and the former Soviet Union.

Submissions should include a short CV and an extended abstract (maximum 2,000 words) or a full paper. Accepted participants will be notified by April 15, 2016. Full accepted papers are expected by May 20, 2016.
